Biography

Polish pianist Roksana Dąbkowska is a postgraduate student at the Royal Northern College of Music under the tutelage of Dina Parakhina and Graham Scott. Roksana received a full scholarship - ABRSM - to study her Masters diploma in 2022. Roksana will continue her Postgraduate studies in the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London next year with a scholarship.

She became a laureate of the Zachodniopomorski Chopin Competition 2017 and the 4th International Subcarpathian Chopin Piano Competition For Young Pianists. Besides, Roksana has also received commendation in third International Competition Augustów. She has also become a laureate of the third prize in IX "Andrea Baldi" International Piano Competition in Bologna.

She has participated in many festivals and piano masterclasses such as the Eppan Piano Academy in 2022, 7th and 8th International Masterclass Course for Young Pianists Radziejowice by The Fryderyk Chopin Institute, 7th and 8th Piano Festival Torre de Canyamel in 2018 and 2019, VIII Imola Summer Piano Academy and Festival.

Over the years Roksana has had lessons and masterclasses with renowned teachers such as Dang Thai Son, Yoheved Kaplinsky, Wojciech Świtała, Dimitri Aleveev, Kevin Kenner, Angela Hewitt, Steven Osborne, Tobias Koch, Katarzyna Popowa-Zydroń, Boris Petrushansky, Ewa Pobłocka, Elżbieta Stefańska.

Biography

Wenchun Fan was born in China and started to play violin aged five. In 2013, she entered the Central Conservatory of Music in Beijing studying with Jia Zhang, Liwei Tan and Wei Xue. She has participated in many prestigious concerts and festivals, such as the Beijing Youth Art Festival and the international Art Festival. In 2017 she was granted the George Henry Peters Scholarship for her Postgraduate studies at the RNCM. As a soloist, she has given recitals in Beijing, Qingdao, Nanning, Guangzhou, Manchester, Birmingham, Leeds and Warrington. She started her PhD at the University of Leeds in 2020.

Tiannan Ye

Tiannan Ye is a Chinese Violinist. His music career started at the age of six. In 2014 he began studying at the

Zhejiang Conservatory of Music. In 2018 he joined the Zhejiang Symphony Orchestra as a violinist, performing over 100 concerts with the orchestra. In 2020, he came to the RNCM to continue his studies with Callum Smart and Leland Chen.

After completing his performance Masters degree in 2022, he began his music research career at the University of Huddersfield under the Supervision of Dr David Milsom and Dr Steven Jan.

Siyi Dai

Siyi Dai began studying piano at the age of four and at the age of eleven gained admission to the Music School attached to Xinghai Conservatory of Music. After completing her studies she was awarded a scholarship to study at the RNCM under the tutelage of Bingbing Li and graduated in 2022 with First Class honours. In the same year she began her Master degree study at the RNCM under the tutelage of Graham Scott.

Siyi enjoys performing and has given recitals Xinghai Concert Hall in Guangzhou, The Steinway & Sons Centre, Horowitz Recital Hall in Shanghai, St Ann's Church, Manchester and Buxton United Reform Church.

Siyi has won several competitions including second prize in the third Austrian Youth Piano Competition, second prize in the second American International Young Pianist Competition and first prize in the Junior professional group of the sixth Hong Kong International Piano Competition.

Biographies

A recent graduate from the Royal Academy of Music with a Master of Arts under cellist Hannah Roberts, **Yuuki Bouterey-Ishido** is a professional cellist performing around the UK and Europe.

Yuuki has performed at major festivals around the world, including the Schnittke Festival in London and the *Semaine Internationale de Piano et musique de chambre* in Switzerland. Other significant performances include solo recitals in Japan, Italy and New Zealand. He has also toured Europe extensively over three years as a member of the Menuhin Academy Soloists under the direction of Maxim Vengerov.

Yuuki is a passionate chamber musician and has been awarded various chamber music prizes, as well as being invited to perform in various chamber festivals in Europe. He currently performs as a member of the Anarres Trio.

Masterclasses include those with Julian Lloyd Weber, Alexander Ivashkin, Frans Helmerson, Gautier Capuçon, Christoph Henkel, Ralph Kirschbaum, Antonio Lysy, David Waterman and Miklós Perényi. Major prizes and awards include a Diploma of the Royal Academy of Music, the String Player Award at the Gisborne International Music Competition 2017, First Prize in the Barbirolli Cello Prize 2018, and 2nd Prize in the National Concerto Competition in New Zealand, among others.

Born in 1995, **Tianyang** started learning the piano at the age of 5. At 14 she started to study professionally with the esteemed teacher Danwen Wei and his assistant Lei Wang. She entered the Shenyang Conservatory of Music in 2009, achieving outstanding results in The 16th Hong Kong-Asia Piano Open Competition. She won the 2nd Class Award in the Youth Class and the 4th Prize Award in the Chopin Ballade or Scherzo Class. She also received the 3rd Prize in the Shenyang Conservatory of Music Competition in 2011 and 2013. Other highlights include attendance at the Italian Music Fest, Perugia, in 2010 and 2012, where she performed the Mendelssohn Piano Concerto No.1 with Sergei Babayan conducting. In 2014, Tianyang

chose to embark on undergraduate study at the RNCM with Graham Scott - the Head of School of Keyboard Studies, receiving the prestigious Lord Rhodes Scholarship and FW Wright Piano Scholarship to support her study. In 2017, she got in to the final of Concerto Audition by playing Shostakovich Piano Concerto No.1. In 2018, she received scholarship and travel fund to join the 29th Semaine International de Piano & Musique de Chambre festival. In 2020 she graduated from RNCM with a master degree in music performance under scholarships. In 2022 she accepted the graduate music assistant role at Dorset House School. Recently she performed a lunch time concert in Christchurch, New Zealand.

Sarah graduated with a first class degree and performance diploma from the Royal Northern College of Music and Manchester University where she studied the flute as Henry Fielding Scholar. She studied with Richard Davies (BBC Philharmonic), Linda Verrier and Jo Boddington (Hallé). She has since developed a portfolio career encompassing performing, teaching and delivering education and community projects.

As a committed chamber musician, Sarah is a member of The Sterling Trio with whom she has performed throughout Britain since 2006, including giving concerts for Leeds International Festival, St. Martin-in-the-Fields and St. James' Piccadilly. Sarah also plays in the Da Capo Duo (flute and classical guitar) which, since 2003, has given over 100 concerts for many of Britain's music clubs and societies including Oundle International Festival and Lake District Summer Music. The Duo was also part of the prestigious Countess of Munster's Recital Scheme.

Freelance performing work frequently includes performing with orchestras including the British Philharmonic Concert Orchestra, the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra, the London Mozart Orchestra and Skipton Camerata as well as music theatre companies. Sarah has also performed at the Houses of Parliament as well as being filmed for the Real Housewives of Cheshire.

Sarah works more broadly as a musician, leader, composer and teacher in variety of fields including music in healthcare, music in the community, music in education, music in criminal justice and collaborative cross-art form projects with organisations including Manchester International Festival, Manchester Camerata, Streetwise Opera and Music in Prisons. As the Creative Director of *Tram Tracks* - a creative composition project conceived by Sarah and delivered in partnership with the Bridgewater Hall - Sarah engaged nearly 100 community and education groups across Greater Manchester for the 25th birthday of the tram network. Sarah also lectures at The University of Manchester and the RNCM, and designs and delivers artist development training for TiPP and Chetham's School of Music.

Lauren Turner completed her Undergraduate and Postgraduate studies at the Royal Northern College of

Music where she studied solo piano and piano accompaniment with John Gough. A former pupil of Chetham's School of Music, Lauren now performs regularly throughout the country as a soloist, accompanist and chamber musician.

As a member of The Sterling Trio (flute, clarinet and piano) Lauren was a finalist in the Tunnell Trust Music Club Awards Scheme and with UK Young Artists. The Trio were also finalists in the Park Lane Group Young Artists Concert New Year Series and as part of this, gave a recital at the Queen Elizabeth Hall, London. Other performances have included recitals at St. James's Piccadilly London, The Leeds International Concert Season and a tour through Enterprise Music Scotland. Committed to expanding the repertoire for their instrumental combination, the Trio has collaborated with distinguished British composer Howard Blake OBE, to create and première a selection of new works at St. Martin-in-the-Fields, London, as artists with the Concordia Foundation.

Lauren teaches piano at The Grange School in Hartford and is staff accompanist for the school's soloists and choirs. She is also official accompanist for the Chester Young Musician Competition and The Laurence Singers choir who are based in South Manchester. Lauren lives in Altrincham with her husband and two young children.
